**ORDER**

July 11, 2025

The Complainant alleged a superior court commissioner made improper rulings in his criminal cases.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Joseph C. Kreamer, Regina L. Nassen, and Christopher P. Staring did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Statement of Facts & Allegations of Judicial Misconduct

I, \_\_\_\_\_ Sui Juris, submit this formal complaint against Judge \_\_\_\_\_  
for gross judicial misconduct, deprivation of rights under color of law, and failure to uphold the  
U.S. and Arizona Constitutions. Specifically, Judge \_\_\_\_\_ engaged in the following unconstitutional  
actions:

1. Denial of Special Appearance & Due Process Violation

Judge \_\_\_\_\_ denied my right to appear by special appearance as an authorized representative for the principal, thereby forcing jurisdiction over the defendant unlawfully.

This constitutes a deprivation of due process under the 5th & 14th Amendments of the U.S. Constitution.

2. Refusal to Recognize Holder in Due Course Standing

The court denied my status as Holder in Due Course, a fundamental commercial law principle under UCC 3-305 & UCC 1-308, effectively violating my right to contract and discharge liabilities in the proper capacity.

3. Violation of 42 U.S.C. § 1983 – Deprivation of Rights Under Color of Law

By refusing my lawful standing and disregarding constitutional protections, Judge \_\_\_\_\_ acted outside of their judicial capacity and jurisdiction, making them liable under federal law.

4. Failure to Adhere to Judicial Oath & Canons of Ethics

Arizona judges are required to uphold constitutional protections and conduct fair, impartial hearings. Judge \_\_\_\_\_ failed in this duty, creating a judicial bias and an unfair legal process.

Relief Requested

Based on the above allegations, I request the following actions be taken:

2. Sanctions or disciplinary action as deemed appropriate by the Commission.
3. Reversal of all unconstitutional rulings issued under Judge \_\_\_\_\_ direction in my case.
