The Complainant alleged a justice of the peace silenced him in a court proceeding and would not let him argue a constitutionalist jurisdiction issue in a traffic case.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Regina L. Nassen and Delia R. Neal did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

III. STATEMENT OF FACTS AND VIOLATIONS

- 1. Violation of Due Process and Procedural Fairness • Judge _____ has consistently silenced the complainant during hearings, denying any meaningful right to be heard or respond to accusations. • In one incident, he abruptly terminated the phone appearance, disconnecting the line mid-proceeding, which denied all rights to rebut, present evidence, or raise jurisdictional challenges.
- 2. Refusal to File and Stamp Motions • Court personnel under Judge _____ bench have refused to accept valid, timely motions, demanding that all filings be handwritten and then still refusing to docket them after submission. • This is a clear obstruction of access to justice and a breach of administrative responsibility, violating Ariz. R. Civ. P. 5(d) and constitutional rights to redress grievances.
- 3. Practicing Law from the Bench • Judge _____ has stepped outside his judicial role by making prejudicial comments, giving directions that amount to legal advice to the opposing party, and improperly influencing the proceedings as an advocate instead of a neutral arbiter.
- 4. Bias, Intimidation, and Unlawful Orders • The judge has exhibited clear bias, favoring the opposition and creating a hostile environment for the complainant. • These actions amount to judicial misconduct, abuse of discretion, and breach of fiduciary oath.

IV. REQUESTED REMEDY AND INVESTIGATIVE DEMAND The complainant demands: • A full investigation into Judge _____ conduct, particularly his obstruction of filings, abuse of discretion, and prejudicial behavior. • A written explanation and certification of the policies requiring handwritten motions, and why such filings are then discarded. • Immediate disciplinary review, including potential suspension or removal for violation of the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct, Canon 1, 2, and 3. • Referral to the U.S. Department of Justice or Arizona Attorney General if civil rights violations are confirmed.
