The Complainant alleged a city court commissioner was biased against him in a protective order matter.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission member Regina L. Nassen did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

Please note it is the complainant's responsibility to provide the name of the judge they are complainaing against. Additionally, your email makes conclusory statements about the judge's alleged conduct but fails to provide any specific facts to support these statements. For example, you state the judge violated your right to due process and equal protection, but you fail to specifically state how this occurred.

Please revise your complaint so that it can be considered by the Commission. Thank you.

Statement of Complaint:

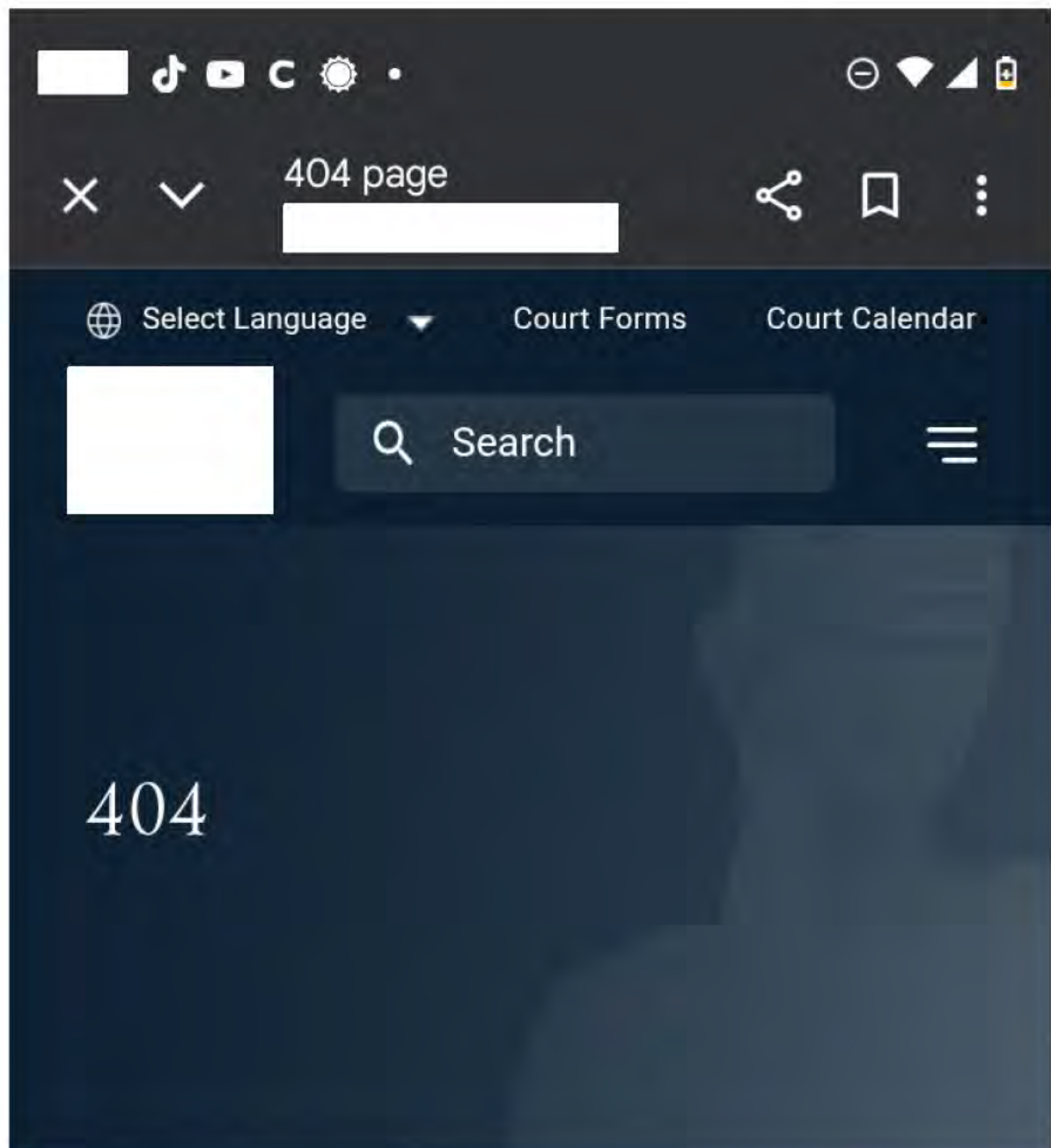
