ORDER

The Complainant alleged a superior court judge improperly held her in contempt in a family law matter.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

A determination was made inconsistent with the protections afforded to individuals with disabilities under ADA Title II. The decision reflects reliance on assumptions and bias regarding respondent's disabilities rather than competent evidence resulting in discriminatory treatment and the denial of equal access to judicial process.

She just recently put me in contempt for non payment for equalization payment but the reason I didn't pay I was waiting to go in front of her. She said I made a year and I only make , with that being said it drastically changed my alimony, the equalization division process and she also violated Article 2 Section 18 and that is putting me in jail for non payment of equalization.

She also signed everything from opposing party that differs from what is on the record. She ruled on evidence that was not admitted and then she ruled on evidence that was admitted that she didn't acknowledge that was my healthcare care, how much it would cost me after the divorce, this on the decree. The amended decree makes no sense mathematically and she took opposing party's table of division without looking at mine and it caused irreparable damage. She forced the writ of my property to my ex husband due to this non payment and that is the only legal income I can make is passive income. She allowed my ex husband to sale my rental property that she factored into my income. She also ruled on making me pay his attorney's fees and she put in in contempt while the other party was in contempt first.

She stopped payment on the alimony, she used it as a weapon. In the same hearing she said I have to pay my husband a month and I only make after medicare and taxes a month.

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
