The Complainant alleged a city court judge gave preferential treatment in a condemnation proceeding.

The role of the Commission on Judicial Conduct is to impartially determine whether a judicial officer has engaged in conduct that violates the Arizona Code of Judicial Conduct or Article 6.1 of the Arizona Constitution. There must be clear and convincing evidence of such a violation in order for the Commission to take disciplinary action against a judicial officer.

The Commission does not have jurisdiction to overturn, amend, or remand a judicial officer's legal rulings. The Commission reviewed all relevant available information and concluded there was not clear and convincing evidence of ethical misconduct in this matter. The complaint is therefore dismissed pursuant to Commission Rules 16(a) and 23(a).

Commission members Regina L. Nassen and Christopher P. Staring did not participate in the consideration of this matter.

The Judge violated our 4th Amendment when the gave preferential treatment to the agent involved at City of . We live in an incorporated town it sits on a land grant. My brother was staying at our home the judge signed a court order to allow a search to enter the property to conduct residential code violation. Late to boarded and condemned. This house is not registered as a rental place and there are no tenants we are heirs to this property. The warrant was addressed to who deceased years ago, the other was who is my brothers and I oldest sister. There is no lease. Their entry was illegal it reads owner's were not available to serve the warrant and they entered on a different search warrant to search for my daughter on a probation violation. This was a one sided event not contacting nor making thorough investigative. The names of both on the warrant have a different address on the county recorders office and treasure office. They left the search warrant on the table to later be informed by code enforcement to picture validated no warrant on the table. My brother was arrested and my daughter was and the house is now condemned. We have little money to make repairs we did not get a follow up date to fix the house. My brother was attempting to fix it by cutting out the sheet rock to the wall where the water leak was, the water was not on due to the leaky bathroom pipes behind the wall. There was no court date to bring forth to the judge and no written instructions on how to proceed. I requested documents to the code enforcement and they did not respond. Court information is public information and it was not available until month after opportunity to file a complaint to sue

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
